City Council leader refuses to meet to discuss how to save Beeston's businesses

City Council leader, Jon Collins has refused to meet me and the leaders of both Broxtowe and Notts County Council, to discuss compensation for shops and businesses in Beeston and Chilwell who face closure.

In a letter sent last week to Councillor Collins I explained that Pentagon, the Seat dealership in Chilwell/Beeston, have informed me they will close (with the loss of 20 jobs) if they continue to lose sales because of the Chilwell/High Road road closure. They are not entitled to any compensation.

Some shops like Cameron House are facing losses that the current financial package does not meet. The City and County Council have stumped up two million pounds to compensate small businesses in Beeston affected by the works but only up to 70% of losses and with a cap of £13,500. This deal was based on Chilwell and High Road remaining open to one way traffic. It now resembles a building site and is completely closed to traffic. Councillor Collins says I should talk to Councillor Jane Urquhart head of Transport and who is "not around" until August 12th.

Rats!

At a meeting with NET and officials from the Borough Council I raised the appalling situation facing residents on Lower and Fletcher Road with rats. I was promised last Monday that action would be taken. I was promised the same on Friday. Yesterday, the matter made Central News (click [here](#) to view the story) and it seems Broxtowe Borough Council is finally taking action.



Kimberley coming together

It was a pleasure to meet up with Jeff Buck who helped start Rumbletums Cafe in Kimberley and who are celebrating their second birthday. This social enterprise provides training and work for young people with special needs and is going from strength to strength. Stapleford Carnival Carry On

I hosted a meeting between the Carnival and Parade Organisers (Hemlock Lions Club), community leaders Councillor Stan Hepinstall, Notts County Council and the police to see if the police would re consider their decision not to marshal this year's parade and indeed future parades. They refused saying the main reason was their decision to adhere to 2009 guidelines issued by ACPO (Assoc. of Chief Police Officers).

It means the parade will have to be cancelled this year and as you might imagine we were all less than impressed. The better news is that by bringing folk together I am confident we will be able to buy a "traffic management scheme" for the 45 minute parade through Stapleford next year. We will have to find a lot of money and Stan has offered some from his community fund. I am sure others will

follow his excellent lead. Remember the Carnival has not been cancelled - see you there on **Saturday September 7th.**

I visited the brown field land on the Boots site which is earmarked for hundreds of new homes if not over 1,000. This is precisely the sort of development Broxtowe Borough Council should be giving full assistance to instead of backing plans for hundreds of houses on our Green Belt land.
