Kimberley Town and Borough Councillor refuses to resign after offensive racist slur.

Kimberley Town and Broxtowe Borough Councillor Andy Cooper has refused to resign after he used highly offensive and racist language about former Green Party Town Councillor, Katharina Boettge, describing her as "Eva Braun" who was Hitler's mistress. Katharina was born in Germany and has lived in the Nottingham area for 15 years.

As a result of Mr Cooper's description of Katharina, Janet Pearce, who is a member of the same political party as Cooper, became the tenth Kimberley Town Councillor to



resign. Janet gave two reasons for her resignation - her concerns about the Council's finances and Andy Cooper's comments which had been written in an email sent to her, other Councillors and the Town Clerk.

On Friday morning, Kimberley's Town Council clerk forwarded my previous evening's email newsletter to all members of the Council. In it I had described a meeting of the Kimberley Residents Association which was attended by David Kirwan and Katherina Boettge. David and Katharina explained why they had resigned from Kimberley Town Council.

Mr Cooper replied to the clerk and others as follows

"Amazing how Kirwan and Eva Braun can turn up at KRA meeting but go missing for KTC". Unfortunately Mr Cooper not only failed to apologise immediately to Ms Boettge, he made a very serious situation even worse by trying to make light of it and to justify his comments to the press and in an email to me.

This is a very serious matter and as your MP, I take great care before calling on a Councillor to resign. Andy Cooper picked on Ms Boettge's racial origin and then likened her to a Nazi. It's about as bad as can be imagined and he should go.

Mr Cooper, like Janet Pearce is a member of the Labour Party, but Broxtowe Labour Party has said nothing about this matter. The person who should have resigned on Friday wasn't Janet, but Andy Cooper.

Tram works and parking meetings

My thanks to everyone who turned out with two days notice

on Friday evening, for a meeting about the long-standing problems with commuter parking and speeding cars on Dovecote Lane and its neighbouring roads.

I have written to the Leaders of Notts County and Broxtowe Borough Council as a result, and am pleased to report Alan Rhodes from the County has already replied. The excellent meeting was organised by Ros Holden and other residents and I have shared my letter with them.

In addition to raising the specific problems and solutions around Dovecote, there is a much wider issue of commuter parking in the Beeston and Chilwell area which will be exacerbated when the tram arrives. In short we don't have enough long stay car parking spaces and I have called on both Councils to plan for the problem now not in 12 months time!

I raised the issue at my meeting on Friday morning with the City and County Councils, NET and tram constructors TWA. We discussed a large number of matters and I will email people with details of our discussions.

I do however, want to mention the continuing issue of fence heights. TWA made it absolutely clear that this is a matter for Broxtowe Borough Council's planning committee and City Council leader Jon Collins agreed. TWA are following agreed proposals and if residents are to get what they want it is for Broxtowe to allow higher fences. There is a meeting of said Committee in September and we will see who is running Broxtowe - the Leader, Milan Radulovic or his planning officers!

Puppy and Kitten farms

My thanks to everyone who has emailed me about a debate on Thursday about puppy and kitten farming. The motion calls on the Government to "review existing legislation to



ensure that it is consistent with its own guidance that prospective owners should always see the puppy or kitten with its mother, and to ban the sale of puppies and kittens from retail centres such as pet shops, garden centres or puppy supermarkets".

I particularly support the following part of the motion;

"further calls on the Government and welfare organisations to work together to raise awareness among the public about choosing a dog responsibly from only ethical breeders or by adoption from legitimate rescue organisations, and to consider further steps to end the cruel practice of irresponsible and unethical breeding of puppies and kittens in the UK."

It is a criminal offence to cause unnecessary suffering to an animals and local authorities already have extensive powers in relation to dog breeders. However, I anticipate the motion will generate support and will follow the debate with keen interest.
