We discussed a number of other matters but in short, there is a need for strong independent traders associations with working with local Councils.

Tram shambles - rumours and rumblings

There are various rumours about the state of the recently laid tram tracks. Concrete samples have been taken and it is being said that the wrong type of concrete has been used in part of the route through Beeston and Chilwell.

There are also concerns that expansion joints or their equivalent have not been used and this has led to substantial cracks notably on Lower and Fletcher Road. What we do know is that concrete has been removed from a number of points on that part of the route and fresh concrete has been poured in. That work has not been finished despite assurances and as you can see there are a number of coned off areas requiring further work.

I have contacted NET/TWA to ask them to provide a full update. It is the lack of communication that leads to unfounded rumours and fears. A number of traders made their views clear to Priti Patel on



Thursday evening and we are both of the firm view that everyone needs clear dates as to when the tram will be running.

It's a small but perfect example of the mismanagement of the tram project that someone decided to put in a new cycle route sign right behind a large lamp post (as it happens both outside my constituency office). It is now marked to be moved so cyclists can actually read it. Yet more money and time wasted.

Supporting Kimberley Miners Welfare Football Club


