According to BBC Radio Nottingham, Derby City Council have lifted their opposition to the HS2 East Midlands Hub being sited at Toton Sidings. This is good news and I feel that our chances of securing the Hub are growing all the time.

I have met D2N2 - the Local Enterprise Partnership; in short, it's the organisation that brings together everyone with an interest in creating more jobs and better business in Notts and Derbyshire and secures tax payer funds for investment in our area.

We discussed the importance of Toton becoming the East Midlands Hub and the need to make sure that if we are successful, there is a world class business park at the site. I reiterated my opposition to hundreds of houses at the site and will continue to campaign against the proposed housing development.

I have been inundated with requests to join my trip to Parliament and all the places went within a day or two. Such is the interest you can be assured I will organise another trip in December. If you are interested and haven't already contacted us then please let me know.

Nottinghamshire County Council have given final planning consent to an open cast mine at Shortwood Farm between Trowell and Cossall. However, given the plummeting price of coal there is the possibility that any development is still some time off.
